

Board Meeting Wednesday, May 17th, 2023 12:00 PM Martin County Arts Council *Minutes*

PRESENT

CALL TO ORDER

Chase Conner called the meeting to order at 12:05.

MINUTES

FINANCIAL REPORT

Disc Golf Project:

Downtown Building Updates:

108 W Main St (Committee of 100)

The Comm. Of 100 will have to collapse the facade and rebuild from the ground up due to the deteriorating beam (termites/water damage). Engineers will be out to see the best way to collapse the wall without causing more damage.

122 W Main St (Baker & White)

John has mentioned that he is finishing a residential project. Once completed, work will continue on the 122 W Main building.

118 Washington St (Martin Supply)

Downtown Landscaping:

The Town has selected an arborist to rework the Main St and Washington St planters. The project should start the week of May 21st and will include the following:

- Removing previous stumps and roots from the existing beds.
- Backfill areas/beds with necessary topsoil and amend the soil as needed per soil sample guidelines
- Instillation of new trees/shrubs and mulching for the beds.

The tree selected by the arborist is a "Main Street Maple." A relatively new variety that is more downtown-friendly and easily pruned compared to the previous species

Riverfront Development:

The town received \$730,000 from the state in 2022 and \$100,000 from the RTP grant to extend the boardwalk along the river. The estimated cost for the project is \$950,000. The town has applied for a Rural Transformation Grant to cover the remaining cost. Awards will be announced in June.
