# **CALL TO ORDER**

# **Downtown Building Updates:**

#### 108 W Main St (Committee of 100)

It has been decided that the Committee of 100 will need to demolish the existing structure and start anew, as the beam has deteriorated due to termites and water damage. The reconstruction process is expected to commence in the upcoming weeks.

#### 122 W Main St (Baker & White)

According to John, he is in the process of wrapping up a residential project in South Carolina. After completion, the focus will shift toward the 122 W Main building.

#### **Downtown Landscaping:**

The Town has selected an arborist to rework the Main St and Washington St planters. The project should start the week of May 21st and will include the following:

- Removing previous stumps and roots from the existing beds.
- Backfill areas/beds with necessary topsoil and amend the soil as needed per soil sample guidelines
- Instillation of new trees/shrubs and mulching for the beds.

The tree selected by the arborist is a "Main Street Maple." A relatively new variety that is more downtown-friendly and easily pruned compared to the previous species

#### **Riverfront Development:**

The Town is currently working on connecting the existing boardwalk to Moratoc Park, opening up even more outdoor adventure opportunities. The estimated cost for this project is \$1,010,000, but the Town has already secured funding from the state and the Recreational Trails Program grant. We received \$730,000 from the state in 2022 and \$100,000 from the grant in April 2023. And just recently, they were approved for an additional \$180,000 for a Rural Transformation grant in June of 2023 to cover the remaining cost of the project.
